

YEAR 12 - STUDENT INFORMATION

Students will be required to study **seven** subjects. **English** is compulsory, students will be placed in the appropriate English course by the HoD.

Students are to choose **six** further options to complete their course of study. However they can apply to be considered for an independent study option which can replace one subject. The criteria for this is:

- Excellent self management skills as evident from reports and teacher recommendations
- A good attendance record
- Evidence of meeting deadlines and being a proactive student.

Students who wish to consider some Pathways semester courses as part of their Year 12 programme, please click here for information regarding the semester subjects that are available for 2018. The Pathways programme provides students with the opportunity to achieve Level 2 credits while preparing for the world of work.

In selecting a programme of study Students need to consider:

- Your interests and abilities.
- Which subjects you enjoy the most.
- The skills you have and would like to develop.
- Your future career interests.
- Any subject requirements (prerequisites) at the next level.

As you plan your course and choose your subjects, check:-

- The prerequisites for entry into each subject.
- The level at which the subject stops.
- The number of credits generated by each subject.
- Whether the subject offers Achievement Standards or Unit Standards.
- Whether or not the subject is an approved subject (for University Entrance)
- Whether the subject provides Literacy credits in either reading/writing or both
- What subjects, grades, credits are needed for entry to the University/course you are interested in attending.
- The total subject course cost eg. Outdoor Education, Photography.
- That this subject equips you with the skills, knowledge and understanding you need to enter your chosen career path.
- That you have flexibility to change your course design if your career goals change.

It is important that you are interested and enjoy the subjects you choose.

A question you should ask yourself is. "Have I discussed my preferences with my parents and teachers - form teacher, subject teacher, Head of Department, careers and guidance?".

NCEA Level 2 Certificate Requirements

- 80 credits are required
- A minimum of 60 credits must be at NCEA Level 2 or higher, 20 credits can be used from Level 1.
- The 80 credits can be gained in one year or over two or more years.
- Credits may be gained from Achievement Standards or Unit Standard courses.

UE = University Entrance, **R** = Reading; **W** = Writing

LEVEL 12 - STUDENT INFORMATION

- Students may choose any course as long as they have met the prerequisite requirements for entry into Level 2 courses.
- Students who fail entry criteria and want to apply for an exemption, must apply in writing for special entry into a course, and if accepted, will be placed on an interim contract.
- Students who have not met the 10 literacy credits or 10 numeracy credits may be required to repeat the Level 1 courses. This is up to HoD discretion.

All students must confirm their courses on the stipulated days at the beginning of the year at course confirmation. Students will be advised of these dates. Failure to do so may result in students not getting their option choices if courses are full.

Key Points to note

- Please be aware that prerequisites for all courses can change without notice. Entry to courses is not guaranteed and student numbers may be restricted due to factors such as staffing availability for that course, timetabling and other reasons that make it impracticable to enrol all students into a course.
- Courses will only be provided if there are sufficient student enrolments. If necessary related courses will be amalgamated to form a viable class size.
- Orewa College will endeavour to accommodate student subject choices. It will develop a timetable structure that best meets the requirements of the greatest possible number of students.
- Multi-level study is an essential component of the College curriculum. Students may study at any of the different levels, however, any student wishing to study at a higher level must have the appropriate Head of Department.
- Students must meet all course prerequisites or have written Head of Department approval.
- Some subjects require students to pay material fees; these fees vary from subject to subject.
- Some subjects have field trips as part of their course and students must be prepared to participate and pay the appropriate trip costs. They must have a good attendance record before permission is granted.
- All subject fees (or ongoing payments) must be paid / organised with Accounts at the beginning of the school year. All subject fees must be paid in full before a student can progress to the next level in that subject.

Planning for University Entrance next year

- In order to gain University Entrance in Year 13, students need to go to requirements for University Entrance and ensure they note which subjects are eligible for University Entrance.
- Students should look ahead to the requirements of their chosen Tertiary Education Provider when selecting their Year 12 course.

YEAR 12 - STUDENT INFORMATION

Course Fees

Some subjects require students to pay material fees; these fees vary from subject to subject. Some subjects have field trips as part of their course and students must be prepared to participate and pay the appropriate trip costs. All subject material fees or arrangements for payment must be made at the beginning of the course. These subject fees must be paid in full if you want to progress to the next level in that subject.

Refunds

Once a student is enrolled in a course, the course fee is due. Any refund that may be due will need to be applied for.

You will study the epic tale by Homer, which follows the adventures of the Greek Hero Odysseus as he encounters monsters, cyclops, and vengeful gods on his way home from the Trojan War. We will also find out how the city of Pompeii was destroyed in 79AD and study the archaeology that has been left there. Finally we will investigating architecture, mosaics, and other art discovered in the buried city.

L2 GEOGRAPHY

L2

The Tongariro National Park is the case study area we visit to examine these aspects and to do our research assessment. The geographic issue will focus on the disposal of waste in New Zealand. The global study component looks at Endangered Species as a topic, the causes and resulting global patterns.

L2 HISTORY

L2

This course builds on the content and skills developed and examined in Level 1 History but can be successfully completed by students that have not taken History before. In the first internal you choose an aspect of WW2 and complete at least 12 pieces of evidence based research. Your second internal, looking at war crimes, can be linked to your first internal or topics such as the Armenian genocide or British actions at parihaka or in India to name a few. Your two external topics focus on the Vietnam War, with a heavy emphasis on New Zealand's involvement and response, and the atrocities committed in Rwanda, where a policy of ethnic cleansing from the ruling Hutu tribe was carried out against the Tutsi.



L2 ESOL ADVANCED

This course prepares students for NCEA Level 2 English and provides them with literacy requirements for University Entrance. Students study 3 NCEA achievement standards, gaining credits in both reading and writing. Assessment is done using a portfolio style and involves personal research and reading as well as creative writing. The course involves a contextual approach to learning grammar, which enables students to develop their own personal grammar notes. A laptop computer is required.
